

\$2,678,000 in 2002, \$2,363,000 in 1997, up 13 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$510,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$2,168,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$7,377 in 2002, \$5,640 in 1997, up 31 percent.


Government Payments
