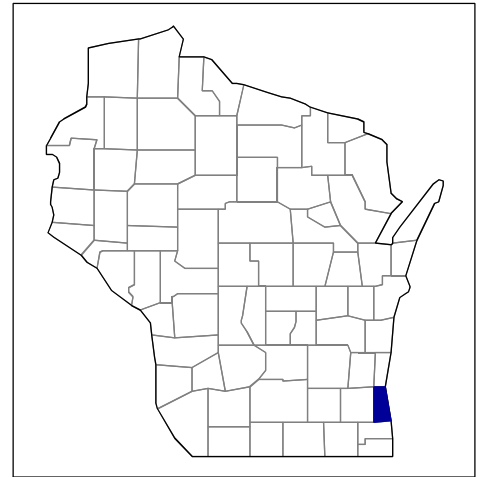


# 2002 Census of Agriculture County Profile

### Market Value of Production, average per farm

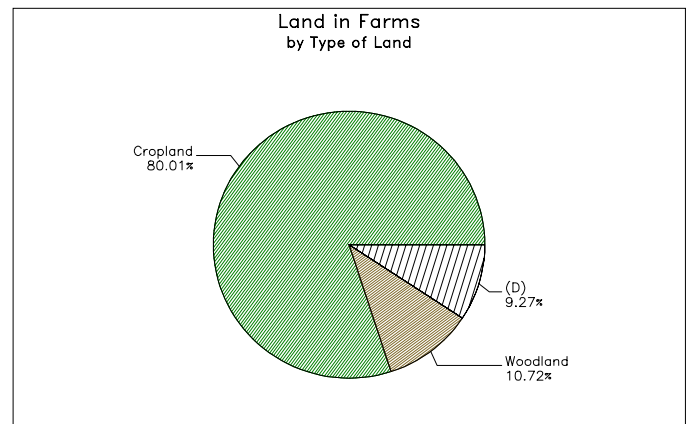
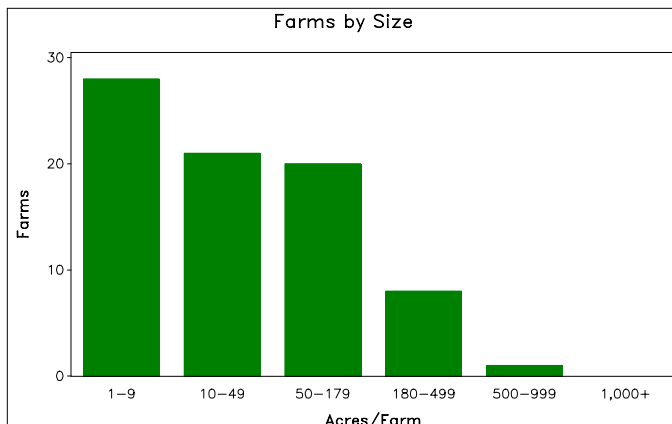
\$115,306 in 2002, \$83,488 in 1997, up 38 percent.
