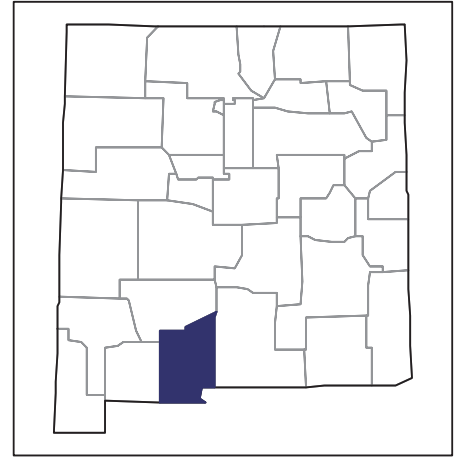

Farms with Women Principal Operators Compared with All Farms

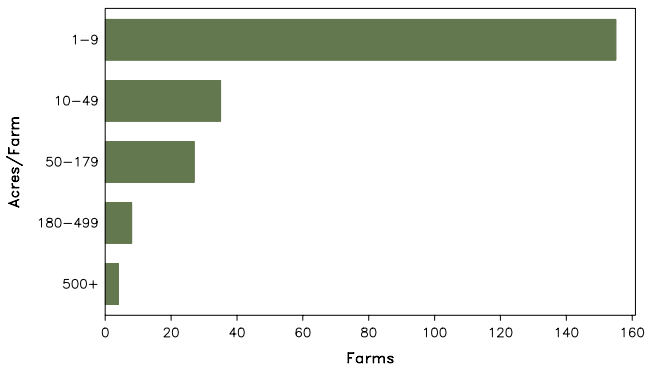

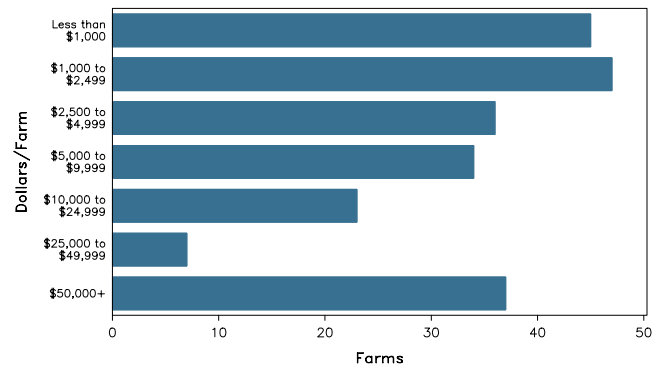

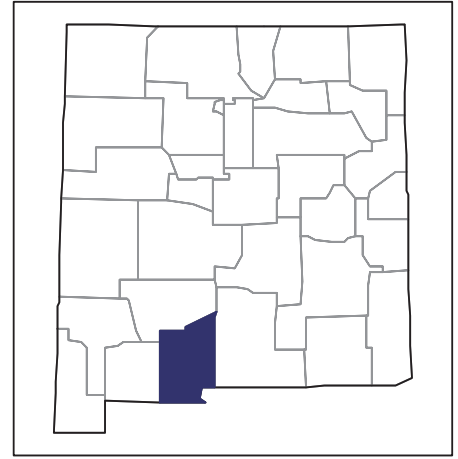

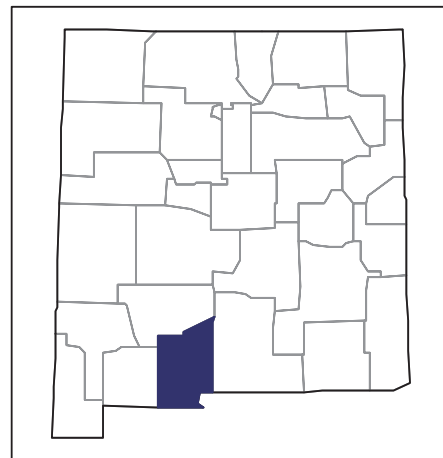

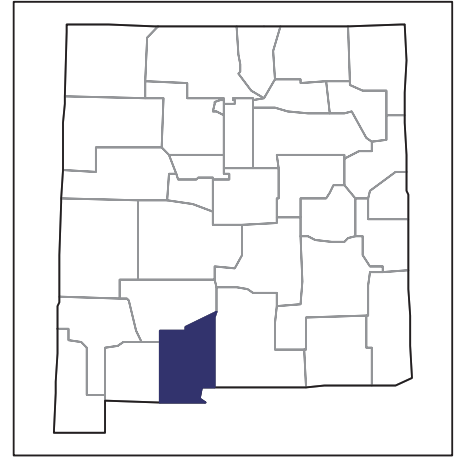

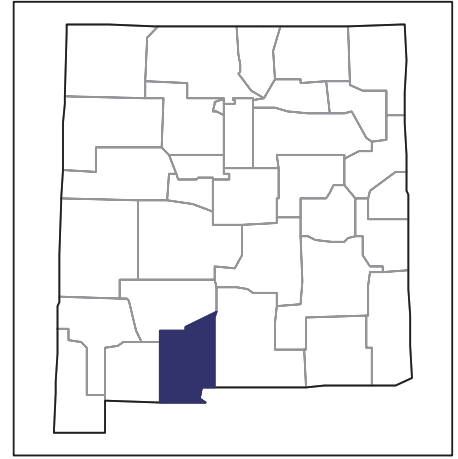

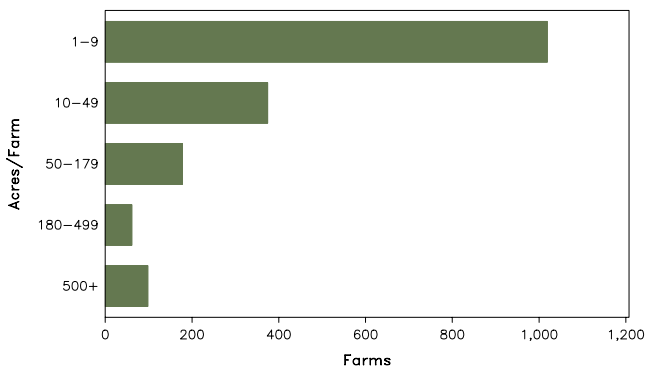

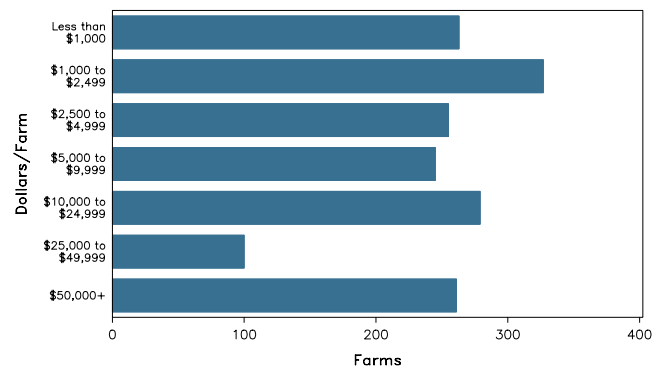
