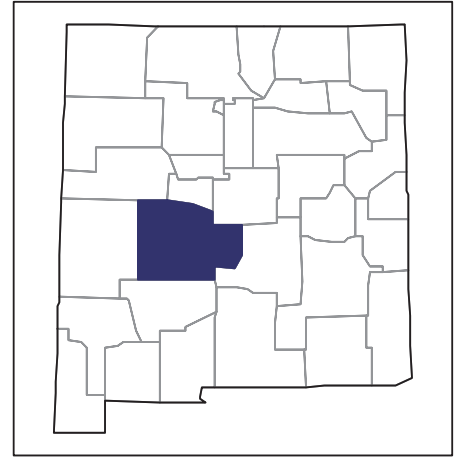

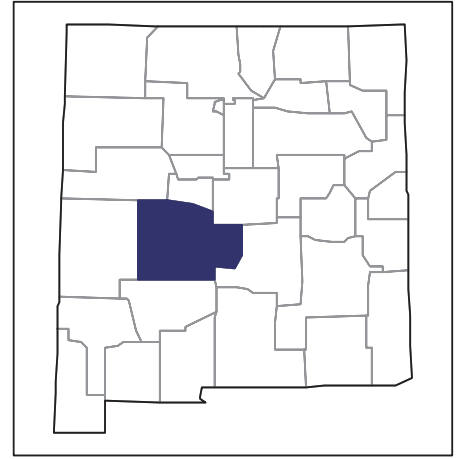

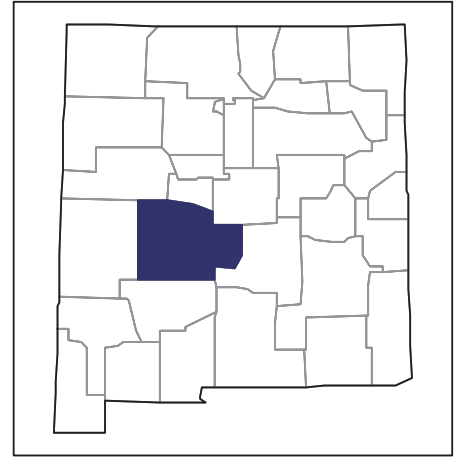

with All Farms**



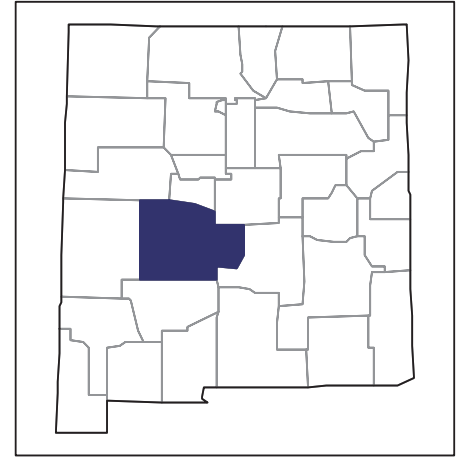

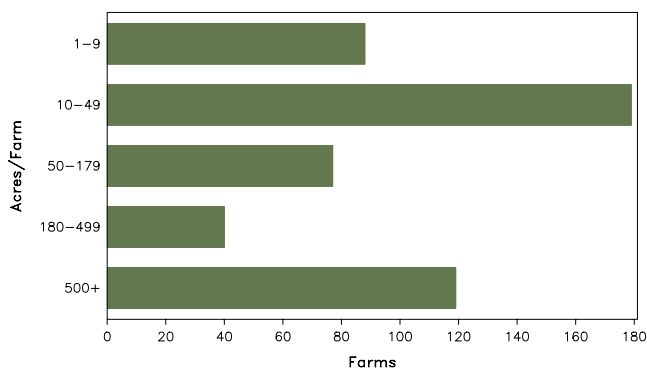

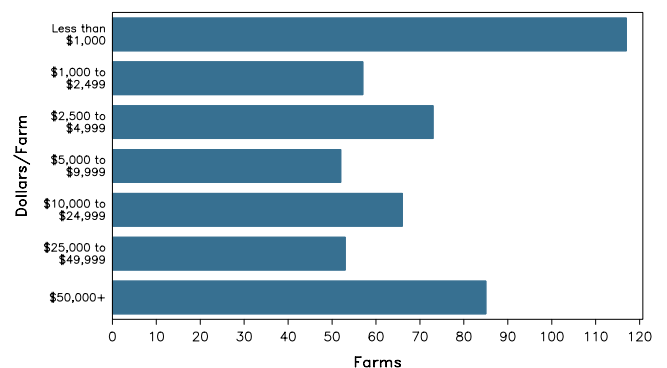
