Farms with Spanish, Hispanic, or Latino Operators Compared with All Farms

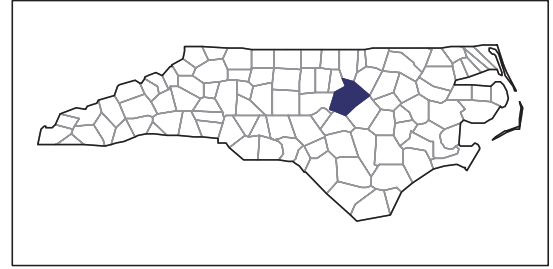

Farms with American Indian or Alaska Native Operators Compared with All Farms

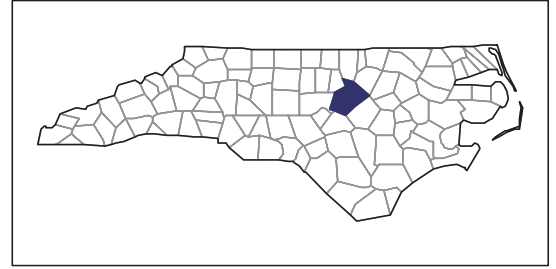

Compared with All Farms**

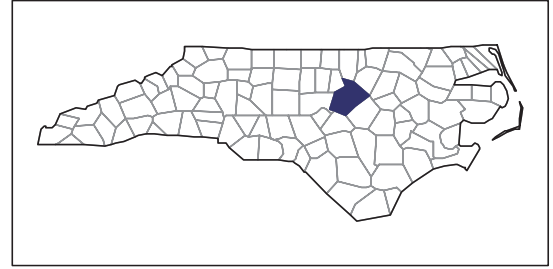

Farms with Black or African American Operators Compared with All Farms

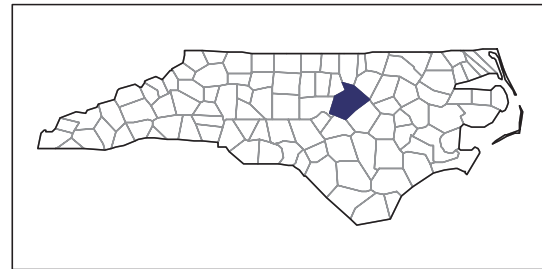

Farms with Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander Operators Compared with All Farms

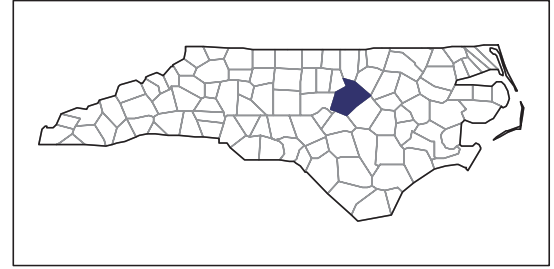

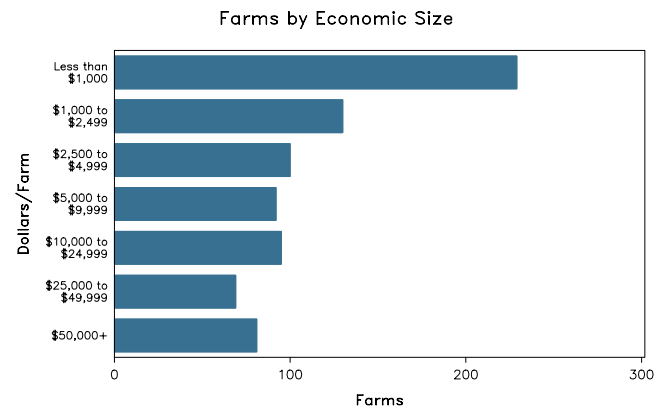
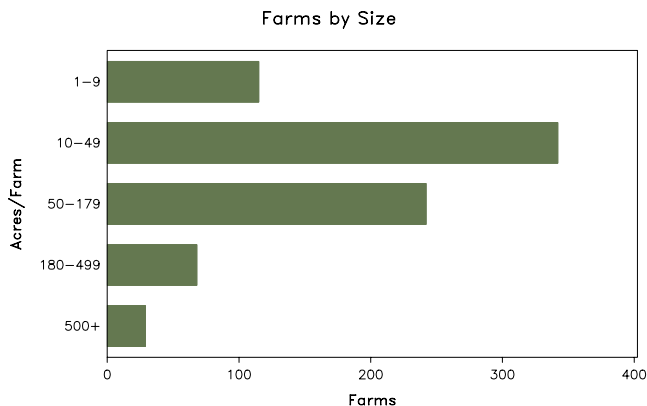
