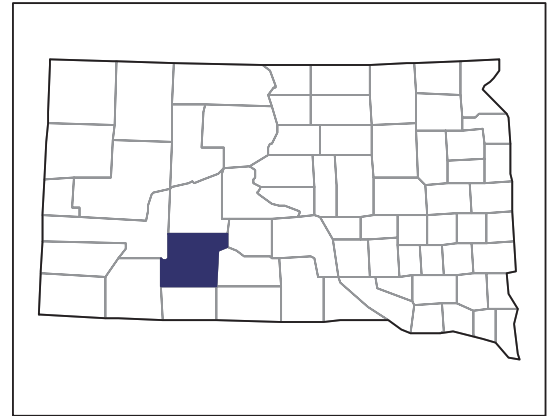

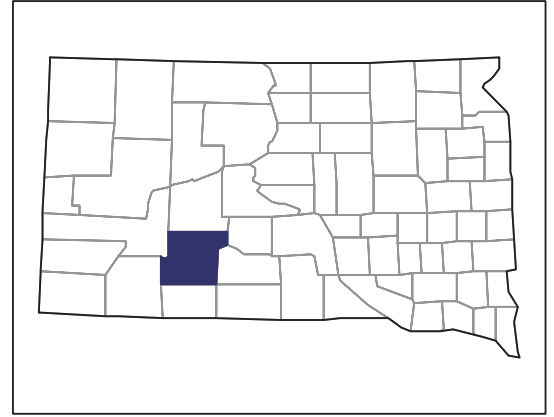

Farms with Spanish, Hispanic, or Latino Operators Compared with All Farms



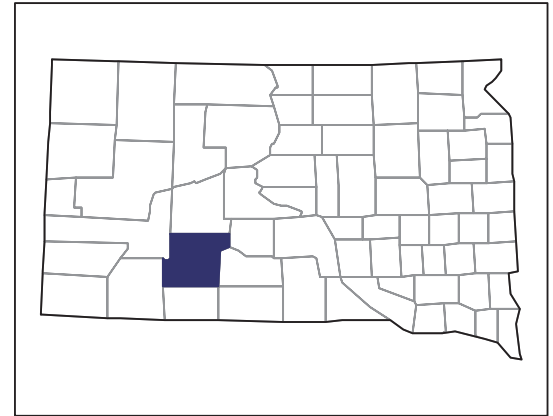

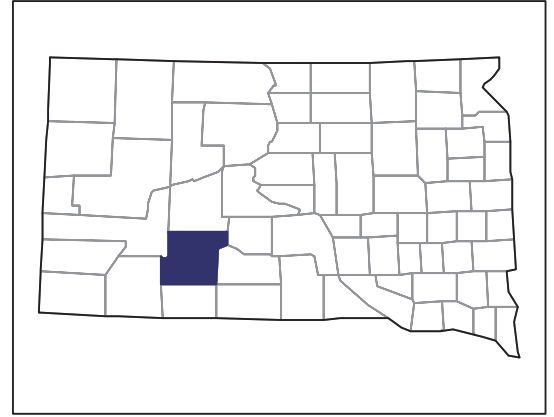

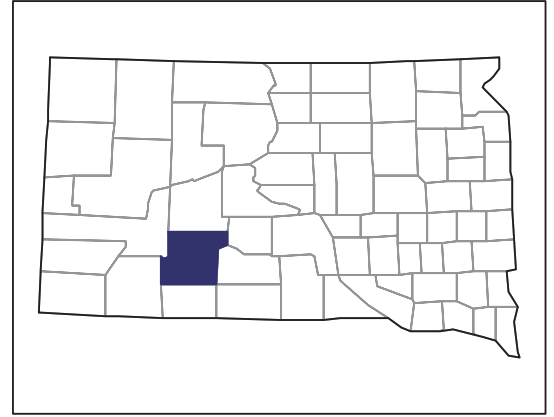

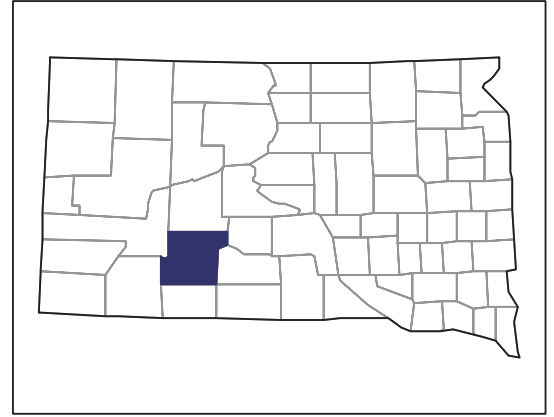

Farms with Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander Operators Compared with All Farms



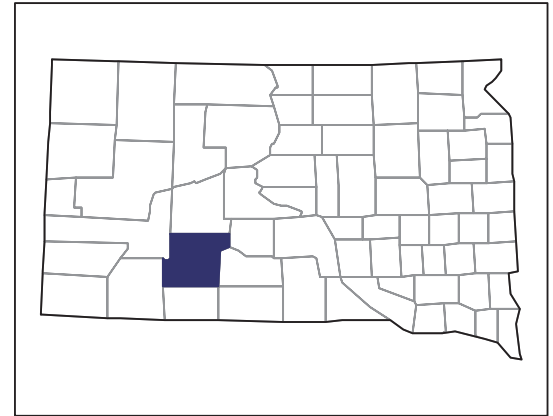

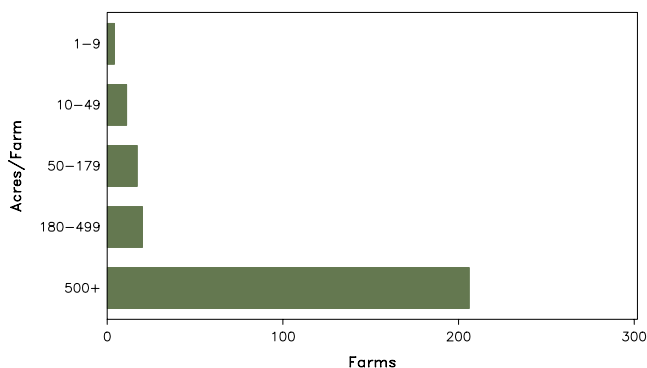

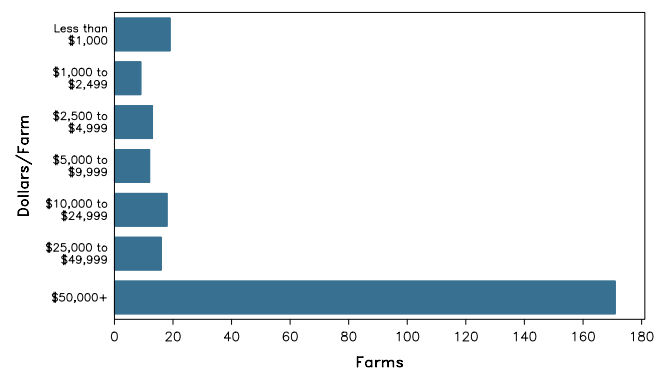
