Organic Highlights

In 2014, the United States had 14,093 organic farms producing \$5.5 billion in organic products. The number of organic farms varies across the country. Arkansas had 34 organic farms.

Of the 34 organic farms identified in the 2014 Organic Survey for Arkansas, 26 were certified organic farms and 8 were exempt from certification because they gross less than \$5,000 annually from organic sales. There were 21 farms with 100 percent total value of sales from certified organic production, and 5 farms with 75 to 99 percent.

The 2014 Organic Survey provides acreage, production, and sales data for a variety of organic crops and inventory and sales data for organic livestock commodities. The 2014 survey collected data from U.S. farms and ranches that were certified organic, exempt from organic certification, or transitioning to organic certification. This survey was done in conjunction with the USDA’s Risk Management Agency to aid in improving insurance products for organic agriculture.
