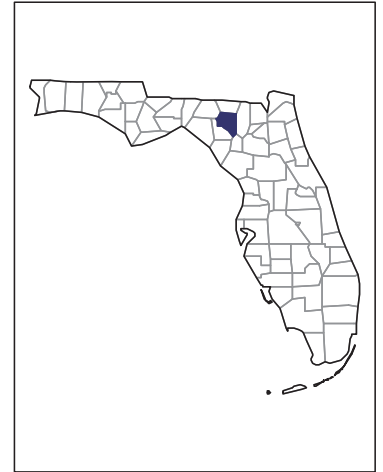

with All Farms

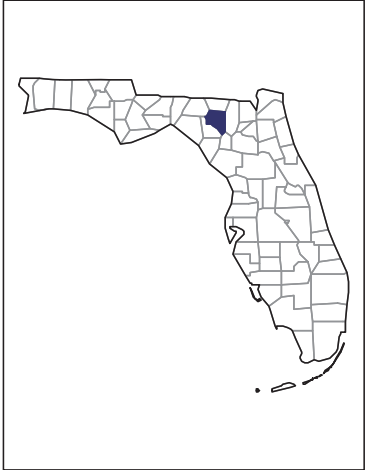
