




# Garfield County - Oklahoma Farms with Asian Operators Compared with All Farms






## Garfield County - Oklahoma Farms with Black or African American Operators Compared with All Farms






Garfield County - Oklahoma Farms with Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander Operators Compared with All Farms





