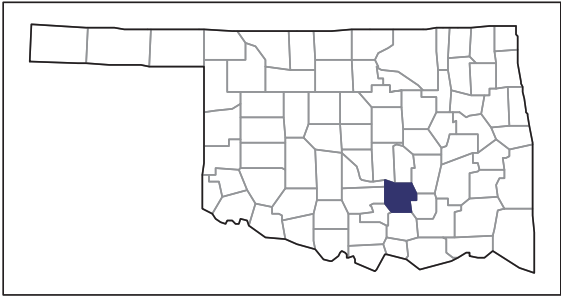

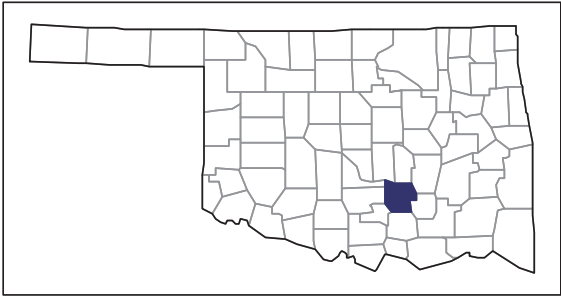

### Pontotoc County - Oklahoma Farms with Black or African American Operators Compared with All Farms



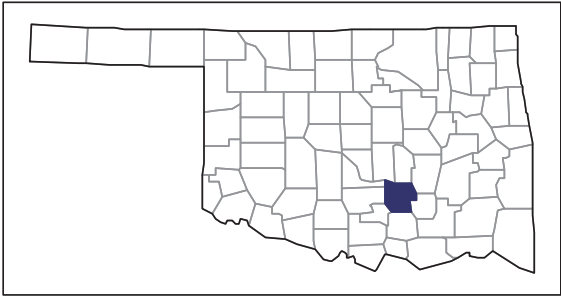

### Pontotoc County - Oklahoma Farms with Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander Operators Compared with All Farms

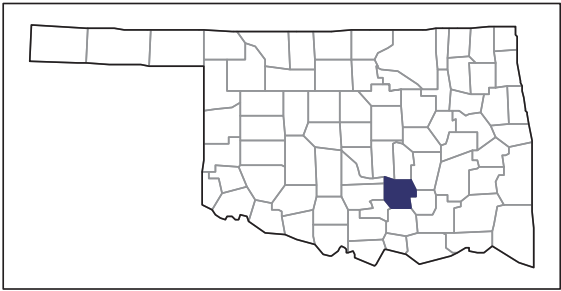

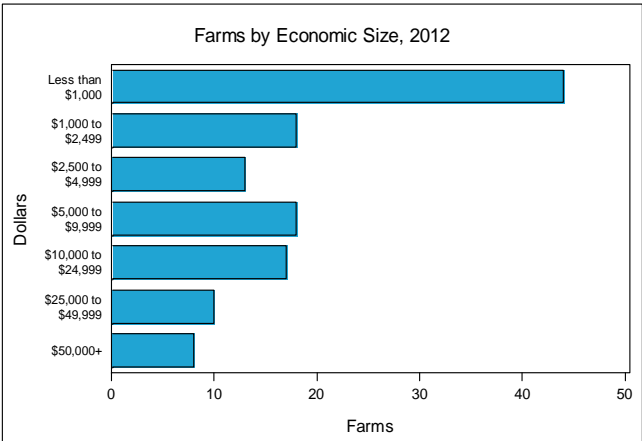
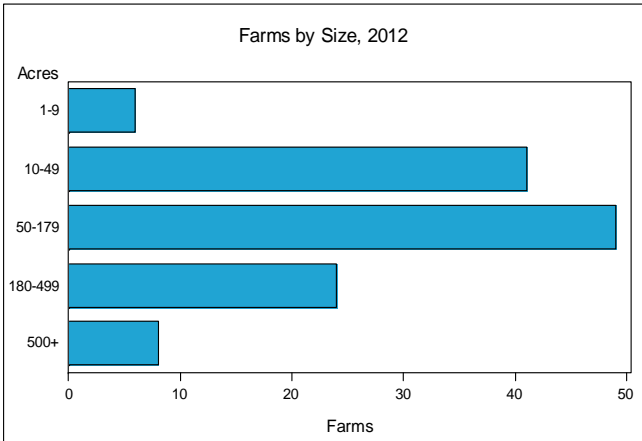
