


Laurens County - South Carolina Farms with Spanish, Hispanic, or Latino Operators Compared with All Farms


Laurens County - South Carolina Farms with American Indian or Alaska Native Operators Compared with All Farms


Laurens County - South Carolina Farms with Asian Operators Compared with All Farms






Laurens County - South Carolina Farms with Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander Operators Compared with All Farms


Laurens County - South Carolina Farms with White Operators Compared with All Farms


