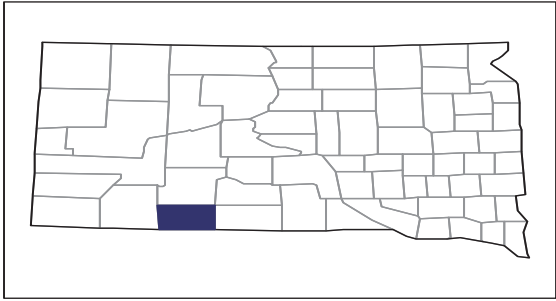

### Bennett County - South Dakota Farms with Women Principal Operators Compared with All Farms



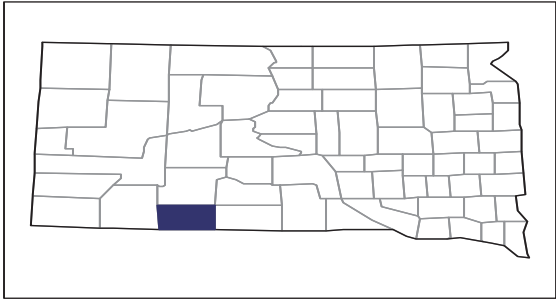

### Bennett County - South Dakota Farms with Spanish, Hispanic, or Latino Operators Compared with All Farms

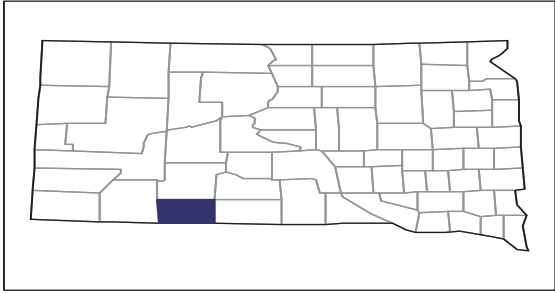

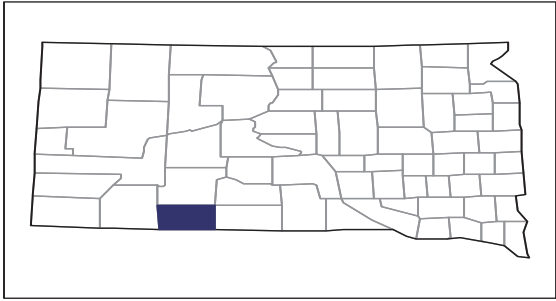

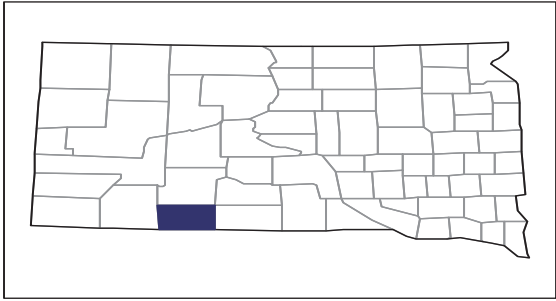

### Bennett County - South Dakota Farms with Black or African American Operators Compared with All Farms



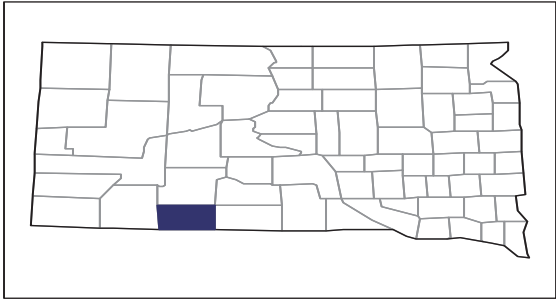

### Bennett County - South Dakota Farms with Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander Operators Compared with All Farms

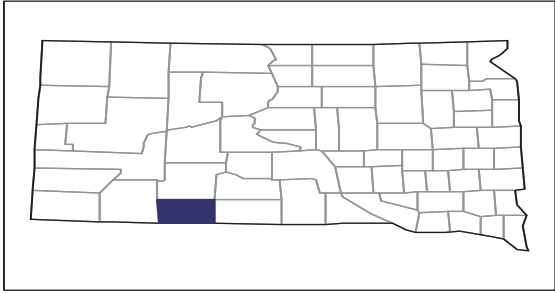
